
## Year 3/4 Project Homework

Using your local library or internet, compare the City of Middlesbrough with New York City or the capital of England (London) with the capital of America (Washington D.C.).

Can you find out about the history of the United States of America? How you present your information is entirely up to you! The more creative and imaginative the better.

Read non-fiction books/use the internet to find out about the American flag and its meaning. Has it always been 'The Stars & Stripes'?

Use a range of materials from home to create your own interpretation of 'The Stars & Stripes'. Collage; paint; print; pencil; felt-tips for example.



Create a poem, rap or song about Donald Trump, Justin Bieber, Taylor Swift or another famous American inhabitant. Be prepared to share your work with the rest of the class and justify for opinion.

Research early civilisations in America. How did they get there? Did they influence people today?

Write a short story using a famous American state or city as your setting. Perhaps Cape Kennedy or the Niagara Falls? Alternatively, create a comic set on a famous city in the USA. Try and include some famous landmarks.

Create a travel brochure about an American State. What is the weather like?

Famous land marks?

Can you recreate any famous American landmarks? The Grand Canyon; The Empire State Building; The Statue of Liberty; Mount Rushmore; Golden Gate Bridge; 'Hollywood' sign for example.
